WENDRON SURVEY DETAILED ANALYSIS

A detailed community survey was carried out between 17th August and 20th November 2022. The questionnaire was delivered to every household and also distributed through the Star Inn Porkellis, Golden Lion Inn Menherion, R&G Motors Carnkie, Rame Post Office and Penmarth Methodist Hall. Collection points were set up at these locations.

51 responses were received in all. The response was heavily biased towards the older population of the Parish, with those in the 55 and over categories dominating. In comparison with the actual age distribution as recorded in the 2021 Census, there is a clear underrepresentation of people under 55, which is particularly significant for the 25 to 34 and 35 to 44 age bands [see figures 2 and 3 below.

This factor will have introduced a bias in the survey responses that should be borne in mind when examining the survey analysis which






The open-ended nature of some questions has also resulted in responses – for example on traffic management and health investment, that the Neighbourhood Plan cannot influence as they are not within its power to do so.

Such information is useful however in providing evidence for the Parish Council to use in responding to consultations from service providers and for lobbying purposes.

The analysis which follows has made a very few but minor adjustments to the data, for example where responses given were not in the category format requested, in which case their meaning has been imputed to the category thought to be relevant. Also, in some questions blank responses have been treated as 'Don't Know' answers. Similarly, in some questions the answer 'unsure' and 'don't know' was given and these have been treated as 'don't knows'.



Q5. What types of housing do you need currently or predict for future for immediate family within the parish?




Q6. What types of development do you need currently or predict for future for immediate family within the parish?






Q7. Do you own a second home or holiday home in the parish?





Wendron parish do not maintain their footpaths and bridleways at all well. Many are overgrown or too muddy in winter.

The car parking on carnkie hill must stop to avoid a very bad accident. The owner of the garage thinks of noone but himself.

The main bus company gives us 7 buses a day to and from Helston and Truro via Carnkie"






